

Design For Communication Privacy Statement

The Design For Communication (DFC) is committed to protecting your privacy and developing technology that gives you the most powerful and safe online experience. This Statement of Privacy applies to the DFC website and governs data collection and usage. By using the DFC website, you consent to the data practices described in this statement.

Collection of Your Personal Information

DFC collects personally identifiable information, such as your e-mail address, name, home or work address or telephone number. DFC also collects anonymous demographic information, which is not unique to you, such as your ZIP code, age, gender, preferences, interests and favorites. There is also information about your computer hardware and software that is automatically collected by DFC. This information can include: your IP address, browser type, domain names, access times and referring Website addresses. This information is used by the DFC for the operation of the service, to maintain quality of the service, and to provide general statistics regarding use of the DFC website. Please keep in mind that if you directly disclose personally identifiable information or personally sensitive data through DFC public message boards, this information may be collected and used by others. Note: DFC does not read any of your private online communications. The DFC encourages you to review the privacy statements of websites you choose to link to from DFC so that you can understand how those websites collect, use and share your information. DFC is not responsible for the privacy statements or other content on websites outside of the DFC family of websites.

Use of Your Personal Information

DFC collects and uses your personal information to operate the DFC Website and deliver the services you have requested. DFC also uses your personally identifiable information to inform you of other products or services available from DFC and its affiliates. DFC may also contact you via surveys to conduct research about your opinion of current services or of potential new services that may be offered. DFC does not sell, rent or lease its customer email lists to third parties. DFC may, from time to time, contact you on behalf of external business partners about a particular offering that may be of interest to you. In those cases, your unique personally identifiable information (email, name, address, telephone number) is not transferred to the third party. In addition, DFC may share data with trusted partners to help us perform statistical analysis, send you email or postal mail, provide customer support, or arrange for deliveries. All such third parties are prohibited from using your personal information except to provide these services to DFC, and they are required to maintain the confidentiality of your information. DFC does not use or disclose sensitive personal information, such as race, religion, or political affiliations, without your explicit consent. DFC keeps track of the Websites and pages our customers visit within DFC, in order to determine what DFC services are the most popular. This data is used to deliver customized content and advertising within DFC to customers whose behavior indicates that they are interested in a particular subject area. DFC website will disclose your personal information, without notice, only if required to do so by law or in the good faith belief that such action is necessary to: (a) conform to the edicts of the law or comply with legal process served on DFC or the site; (b) protect and defend the rights or property of DFC; and, (c) act under exigent circumstances to protect the personal safety of users of DFC, or the public.

DFC Privacy Statement Continued**Use of Cookies**

The DFC Website use "cookies" to help you personalize your online experience. A cookie is a text file that is placed on your hard disk by a Web page server. Cookies cannot be used to run programs or deliver viruses to your computer. Cookies are uniquely assigned to you, and can only be read by a web server in the domain that issued the cookie to you. One of the primary purposes of cookies is to provide a convenience feature to save you time. The purpose of a cookie is to tell the web server that you have returned to a specific page. For example, if you personalize DFC pages, or register with DFC site or services, a cookie helps DFC to recall your specific information on subsequent visits. This simplifies the process of recording your personal information, such as billing addresses, shipping addresses, and so on. When you return to the same DFC website, the information you previously provided can be retrieved, so you can easily use the DFC features that you customized. You have the ability to accept or decline cookies. Most web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually modify your browser setting to decline cookies if you prefer. If you choose to decline cookies, you may not be able to fully experience the interactive features of the DFC services or websites you visit.

Security of Your Personal Information

The DFC secures your personal information from unauthorized access, use or disclosure. DFC secures the personally identifiable information you provide on computer servers in a controlled, secure environment, protected from unauthorized access, use or disclosure. When personal information (such as a credit card number) is transmitted to other websites, it is protected through the use of encryption, such as the Secure Socket Layer (SSL) protocol.

Changes to this Statement

The DFC will occasionally update this Statement of Privacy to reflect company and customer feedback. DFC encourages you to periodically review this Statement to be informed of how DFC is protecting your information.
